Sermon Title: Justification-Saved from the Penalty of Sin

Sermon Text: Romans 5:1-5

March 10, 2019

Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2 through whom also we have obtained our introduction by faith into this grace in which we stand; and we exult in hope of the glory of God. 3 And not only this, but we also exult in our tribulations, knowing that tribulation brings about perseverance; and perseverance, proven character; and proven character, hope; and hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us. (NASB)

Supporting Text: Romans 6:23 – The gift is not like that which came through the one who sinned; for on the one hand the judgment arose from one transgression resulting in condemnation, but on the other hand the free gift arose from many transgressions resulting in justification (NASB)

Central Message: We are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone.

Observation: When God justifies us, He gives us credit for being righteous, but He does not change us as people.

 Point #1: Justification is the act of God not only <u>forgiving</u> believers of their sin but <u>imputing</u> to them the <u>righteousness</u> of Christ.

Imputation is the **counting** of an attribute as belonging the person to whom it is **imputed**.

Imputation does not change a person <u>inwardly</u>. They are simply treated as if they possessed that attribute.

Justification does not make us <u>righteous</u>. God declares us to be righteous.

When Adam sinned, his sin was <u>imputed</u> to us, so God treated us just as if we had committed the same sin as Adam.

Justification is a **completed** work. It happens **instantaneously**.

- Point #2: Saved from the penalty of sin means that we have <u>peace</u> with God through <u>Jesus Christ</u>. (Romans 5:1)
- Point #3: Saved from the penalty of sin means that we have access to faith through grace.
 Romans 5:2
- Point #4: Saved from the penalty of sin means that this is the <u>beginning</u> of our salvation and not the <u>end</u>. (Romans 5:4)
- Point #5: Saved from the penalty of sin means that our troubles become opportunities instead of obstacles. (Romans 5:3-5)
